Baptism Part 2: Meaning and Mode

I. The Meaning of Baptism

- 1. A sign of repentance and faith (Acts 2:27–48)
- 2. A sign of our union with Christ in his death, burial, and resurrection (Rom. 6:3–4; Col. 2:11–12)
- 3. A sign of cleansing and forgiveness (Acts 22:13–16; Tit. 3:5; 1 Pet. 3:21)
- 4. A sign that the kingdom has dawned and the last days are here

II. The Mode of Baptism (Why Immersion is the Most Proper Mode)

- 1. While it is true that the Greek verb $\beta \alpha \pi \tau i \zeta \omega$ can also mean "to wash," its most common meaning is "to immerse."
- 2. Contextual clues in the Gospels and Acts point to immersion as the mode of baptism.
- 3. The symbolism involved in Romans 6 and Colossians 2 points to immersion.
- 4. The witness of church history points to immersion as the earliest practice.
